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- made available to dual enrollment students from Florida public high schools free of charge. This subsection does not prohibit a university from providing instructional materials at no cost to a home education student or student from a private school. Instructional materials purchased by a district school board or institution board of trustees on behalf of dual enrollment students shall be the property of the board against which the purchase is charged.
- (d) Each university shall establish a program of early admission (full-time early college dual enrollment) for eligible secondary school students qualifying for such a program under provisions of subsection 1007.271(2), Florida Statutes.
- (5) Effective beginning with students admitted Summer Semester 2009, early college dual enrollment courses that meet core state university admission requirements in English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Natural Sciences, Social Sciences, or Foreign Languages (as specified in Board of Governors Regulation 6.002(6)(a)(1)) shall receive the same weighting as Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and Advanced International Certificate of Education courses in the calculation of the high school grade point average used for admission decisions.
- (6) Each university shall describe clearly the various options available for acceleration and the criteria governing such options
