FLORIDA BOARD OF GOVERNORS NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDED REGULATION

DATE: September 16, 2022

REGULATION NUMBER AND TITLE: 8.012, Academic Program Termination and Temporary Suspension of New Enrollments

SUMMARY:

The proposed amendment provides additional flexibility to institutions to terminate programs at the doctoral and professional levels without coming to the Board of Governors for approval. Institutions would follow the same process for terminating bachelor's, master's, and specialists programs. The proposed amendment would also make the following changes to align with other Board regulations.

- Under Regulation 8.002, institutions cannot terminate a program funded through Education and General funds in favor of an identical or similar self-supporting or market tuition rate program at the same level.
- Consistent with Regulation 8.008, the termination or suspension of new enrollments in nursing master's programs must be considered for approval by the Board of Governors before implementation.

 - 3. A plan to notify Florida College System (FCS) institutions that the university has begun the process of terminating a baccalaureate program so that FCS students may be advised appropriately; and.
 - 4. A process for evaluation and mitigation of any potential negative impact the proposed termination may have on the current representation of females and ethnic minorities within the faculty and students.
