NOTICE OF PROPOSED NEW REGULATION**

DATE: July 15, 2009

REGULATION NUMBER AND TITLE: 21.203 Optional Campus Master Plan Vision Statement.

SUMMARY: An advisory group has worked over the past year with the Florida Conflict Resolution Consortium to revise and update the Board of Governor Master Planning Regulations. The group is composed of university, local government and community representatives.

The proposed regulation was presented at the March 26, 2009 Board of Governors meeting for public notice purposes; however, due to a clerical error, the notice was not posted for public comment. The proposed regulation was subsequently approved at the June 2009 Board meeting and posted on the regulation page before the error was discovered. To ensure compliance with the public notice requirements of the Board of Governors' Regulation Development Procedure, the proposed regulation is being posted for public comment and, if necessary, will be presented to the Board for reconsideration.
